New press release: "Face-to-face exchange makes adolescents happier than online contact" I Clemens Kroneberg

In a new study, conducted within the framework of the SOCIALBOND project, Cluster member Clemens Kroneberg and his colleagues show that students suffered above all from limited face-to-face contact with friends during the second school lockdown. During days on which they left home or had face-to-face contact with friends, youth were more likely to report being happy and excited and less likely to be sad, depressed, lonely, and bored. In contrast, online contact only – by far the most common form of interaction during the second school lockdown – did not improve their mood. The research team surveyed nearly 600 ninth-graders from 29 schools in North Rhine-Westphalia.
