Transatlantic Tandem Talk with Matthias Heinz

Cluster member Matthias Heinz will give the upcoming Transatlantic Tandem Talk, organised by ECONtribute and the office of the University of Cologne in New York. Matthias will talk about how closely firms should monitor their employees, regarding the costs and benefits of monitoring. He will explore whether and under which circumstances "control is good, trust is better". The event is online, information to register to follow.

There will be two panel discussions this fall, both will be recorded at the WDR studio in Cologne and later broadcasted on radio WDR3. No registration is needed and the entrance is free.

The first on October 25th is dedicated to the concrete impact of disinformation and conspiracy theories on the course of the Corona pandemic in Germany. Author Florian Aigner and Dr. Johannes Nießen, Head of the Cologne Health Department are speaking, among others.

The second panel discussion on 22nd of November is intented to <u>summarize and assess the</u> "digital policy situation", one year after the new coalition has come into place. Among others, Ina Scharrenbach Minister for Regional Identity, Local Government, Building and Digitalization of the Land of North Rhine-Westphalia and Prof. Christoph Bieber, University of Duisburg-Essen are joining.



ReStart Talk with Uta Schönberg

Today, children are one of the main reasons for income differences between men and women - after the birth of their child, women usually work less than men or do not return to their jobs at all. Using the example of East and West German mothers, Uta Schönberg sheds light on how important cultural imprinting during childhood is for mothers' return to work.
